Her primary position is in the Lymphoma / Myeloma department with a co-appointment in the Stem Cell Transplantation and Cellular Therapy department.

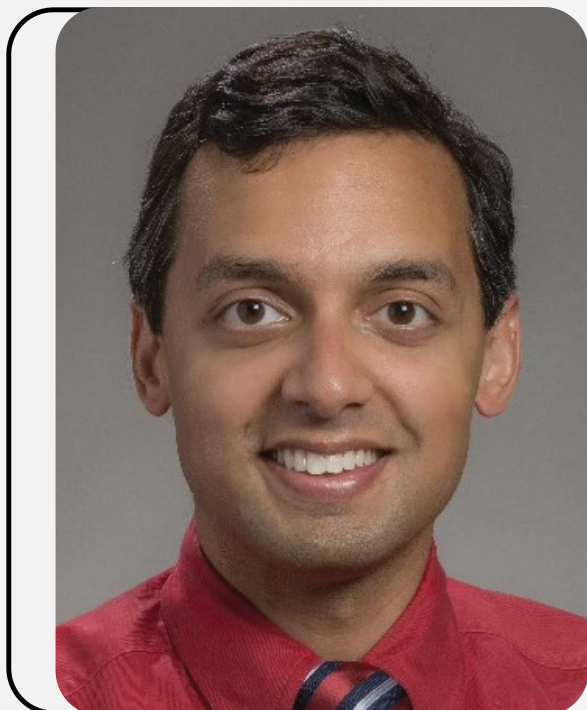
She serves as Co-Chair of the Morbidity, Recovery and Survivorship Scientific Working Committee (focused on Cellular Therapy) as part of the Center for International Blood and Marrow Transplant Research (CIBMTR).

She has authored or co-authored over 130 peer-reviewed journal articles and at least 5 book chapters. She is a member of the American Society of Clinical Oncology, American Society of Hematology, and the American Society of Blood and Marrow Transplantation (ASTCT).

She is a 2022 graduate of the ASTCT Mid-Career Leadership Training Course.

Her areas of clinical practice is in lymphoma, and her research interests and experience are in early phase clinical trials, and chimeric antigen receptor T (CART) cell therapy for the treatment Hodgkin lymphoma and B-cell non-Hodgkin lymphoma.

She is the Director of the CART program in Lymphoma/Myeloma department as well as the operational medical director for the ACT-IEC (Access, Coordination and Tracking of Immune Effector Cell Therapy) program at MD Anderson Cancer Center.
